

Extreme Cold is Here – Practice Safety First!

Every year, slips, trips and falls top the list of preventable injuries, especially in colder months. Here are a few things you can do to reduce your risks and keep you and your family safe:

- Wear proper footwear: Wear slip-resistant shoes with good tread or invest in overshoes for high-risk situations. Remove snow or water from footwear when entering buildings to reduce indoor slipping hazards
- **Practice safe walking like a penguin:** With knees slightly bent, walk with flat feet pointed outward slightly to help keep your center of gravity over your feet. Short steps, slower walking, and increased awareness can help your footing adjust to changing traction conditions.
- **Keep hands free:** Use handrails when available, be it going into a building or getting in or out of a vehicle. Avoid walking with hands in pockets to help maintain balance.
- **Inspect walkways:** After any precipitation, or overnight freezing and thawing, check where water tends to accumulate and does not drain properly.
- **Clear debris:** Leaves can create additional hazards when mixed with water, making walkways even more slippery.

By taking extra precautions, you'll reduce the risk of slips, trips, and falls, and ensure a safer, more efficient winter.



Reading Champions Program Makes Front Page News in Minnesota!

"U. S. Steel brings Reading Champions Program to North Star Elementary"

That was the December 21, 2024, front-page headline from Minnesota's <u>Mesabi Tribune newspaper</u>. The piece was also the paper's Top Story in the online version of the publication, ensuring the news about the kick-off of our Reaching Champions program on the Iron Range was loud and clear for all to hear.

Students at North Star Elementary School were supplied with new books chosen by U. S. Steel employees. Each book also contains a special message of encouragement written by U. S. Steel employees working at our Minnesota Ore Operations facilities (Minntac and Keetac).

"People really took it seriously," Chrissy Bartovich, U. S. Steel senior director Environmental, Tailings, Permitting, and Community Relations said. "They looked at the book and made the messages about what they were going to be reading. It was actually pretty cool to see what people did."

"I believe it's great that we're able to partner with local businesses, especially U. S. Steel," North Star Elementary School Principal Scott Manni said. "The Iron Range has its roots in mining and it's important for young people to get connected with its roots due to U. S. Steel being able to offer this reading program."

To foster a love for books and increase literacy scores, U. S. Steel partnered with the Pittsburgh Penguins Foundation in 2021 to develop the Reading Champions program. Designed to encourage 3rd graders to read for just 20 minutes a day, equal to the length of one hockey period, the program grows with students by progressively challenging them to meet higher levels of achievement, earning awards and developing skills along the way. Reading Champions is now in its fourth season and over 1,150 students have collectively read more than 1 million minutes.  - Donated to the Osceola Goodfellows for the delivery of holiday food boxes to families and senior citizens facing food insecurity.


