

## Mon Valley Works is an integrated steelmaking operation that includes four PA facilities:

- Clairton Plant (Clairton, PA) produces coke and coke byproducts. Coke is the fuel, similar to charcoal, for blast furnaces to convert iron ore into liquid iron.
- Edgar Thomson Plant (Braddock, PA) produces liquid iron in blast furnaces using coke from Clairton and iron ore from Minnesota. Iron is converted into steel and cast into slabs.
- Irvin Plant (West Mifflin, PA) processes the slabs in a hot-roll mill to produce coils of steel.
- Fairless Plant (Fairless Hill, PA) is outside of Philadelphia and produces galvanized steel sheets.

## U. S. Steel also has three other locations in Southwestern PA:

- Research & Technology Center, located in Munhall, focuses on advancing steelmaking.
- Pittsburgh Service Center, located in Pittsburgh's South Side, houses administrative and IT services.
- Headquarters, located in downtown Pittsburgh in the U. S. Tower, houses corporate offices.

## Our Positive Impact in the Mon Valley and Pennsylvania

- U. S. Steel has been making steel in the Mon Valley since 1901, when Andrew Carnegie sold the Carnegie Steel Company, which included Edgar Thomson, to form the United States Steel Corporation.
- Mon Valley Works employs more than 3,000 hard-working men and women, many of whom live in Mon Valley communities.
- Mon Valley Works creates thousands of additional jobs in other industries — chemical, energy, transportation, and many more — throughout Southwestern PA and the United States.
- Mon Valley Works generates \$4.6 billion in economic output throughout the region.\*
- The Pennsylvania steel industry generates \$9.35 billion of economic output a year in Pennsylvania\*\* and plays an integral role in the state's economy. Mon Valley Works is the largest contributor among all Pennsylvania steel operations.

## Safety First and Environmental Performance

Around 1908, U. S. Steel coined the phrase, “Safety First.” We have a longstanding commitment to the health and safety of everyone working in our facilities.

- Safety is in our DNA and part of our S.T.E.E.L principles.
- In 2022, we set a new company record for global days away from work due to injury: 0.05 rate.

Protecting the environment is one of U. S. Steels top priorities. In the Mon Valley Works,

- We spend approximately \$100 million each year on environmental compliance.
- Our Southwestern PA plants have maintained > 99% compliance rate with all permit requirements.
- In 2021 and 2022 — for the FIRST time in county history — air monitors in Allegheny County demonstrated “attainment” with the health-based standards of the Environmental Protection Agency’s National Ambient Air Quality Standards.



## Community Impact

We believe our business thrives when we actively engage the communities where we make steel:

- Through our partnership with the Pittsburgh Steelers, we support students with STEM education programs and honor military veterans with a 'Salute Our Heroes' plaque each home game.
- We partner with the Pittsburgh Penguins to improve literacy and help expand access to sports:
  - The incentive-based Reading Champions program challenges third grade students to read for 20 minutes a day.
  - We sponsor “Try Hockey for Free Day” programs at rinks across western PA to encourage kids to give hockey a try at no cost.
- We co-chair the Carnegie One Capital Campaign with the Pittsburgh Penguins and provided \$1 million to revitalize Andrew Carnegie’s first library in the U.S., ensuring that this valued asset continues to serve Braddock and surrounding communities.
- Since 2019, U. S. Steel has donated \$3.3 Million to 172 organizations in the Mon Valley, Allegheny County and Southwestern Pennsylvania.
